

# Personal Leadership Harvest Checklist

This **Personal Leadership Harvest Checklist** is designed to help you assess where you are sowing and how you can align your leadership with **eternal impact**. Use the reflection questions to evaluate your growth and influence.

### **Assessing Your Leadership Harvest**

For each of the 18 laws below, rate yourself on a scale from **1 to 10**, with **1** meaning "Needs Significant Growth" and **10** meaning "Strong and Consistent." Be honest with yourself—this assessment is designed to help you identify areas of strength and areas for improvement.

After scoring yourself, use the **Leadership Harvest Categories** at the end to evaluate where you currently stand and set goals for growth.

# The 18 Laws of the Leadership Harvest

#### **Foundational Laws**

The core principles that determine the kind of leadership harvest you will reap. These laws emphasize that your actions, decisions, and character set the foundation for success and long-term impact.
You Reap What You Sow – Are your daily actions planting seeds of integrity, wisdom, and faith? (Galatians 6:7)
You Reap More Than You Sow – Are you investing in people in a way that multiplies over time? (Hosea 8:7)
You Reap in a Different Season Than You Sow – Are you patient in trusting God's timing? (Ecclesiastes 3:1-2)
You Must Sow to Reap – Are you actively investing in your leadership growth an the growth of others? (2 Corinthians 9:6)
You Cannot Harvest What You Have Not Planted – Are you taking intentional action in areas where you seek results? (Proverbs 20:4)

The Conditions of the Harvest
A successful harvest requires the right conditions. These laws highlight the importance of cultivating a strong leadership environment, addressing challenges, and ensuring your leadership efforts are sustained.
The Quality of the Harvest Depends on the Quality of the Seed – Are you prioritizing strong character and faith-based leadership? (Genesis 1:11)
The Soil Determines the Harvest's Success – Is your leadership environment or that fosters growth and trust? (Matthew 13:8)

A Neglected Field Produces No Harvest – Are you intentionally nurturing your leadership and those you lead? (Proverbs 24:30-31)

responsibility we all carry, and it's a key part of our leadership journey.

### **Leadership Harvest Scoring**

### **Seed Planter (18-45 points)**

#### **Next Steps:**

- Identify one key leadership habit to develop this week.
- Set short, consistent goals around sowing integrity, wisdom, or faith.
- Find a mentor who models a thriving leadership harvest.
- Commit to regular reflection using this checklist each quarter.
- Begin each day in prayer, asking God for guidance as you sow.

## Growing Leader (46-70 points)

Your leadership is developing, but there are areas that need more intentional investment. Strengthen your daily leadership habits and trust God's process.

#### **Next Steps:**

- Choose two areas from your checklist where growth is needed and create an action plan.
- Schedule time for spiritual and leadership development (books, courses, Scripture).
- Start mentoring someone with less experience than you.
- Ask for feedback from those you lead to gain outside perspective.
- Practice sowing encouragement and trust in your team.

### Faithful Cultivator (71-85 points)

You are consistently sowing into your leadership, and others are beginning to reap the benefits. Keep refining your approach and preparing for an even greater harvest.

#### **Next Steps**

- Evaluate where your influence is growing and where it is stagnant.
- Revisit your long-term leadership vision and align it with God's priorities.
- Host a small group or roundtable on biblical leadership principles.
- Identify one potential distraction or "weed" to eliminate.
- Celebrate and share a leadership win that has blessed others.

## Bountiful Harvester (86-95 points)

Your leadership is bearing fruit, impacting those around you in meaningful ways. Focus on sustaining your growth and mentoring the next generation.

#### **Next Steps:**

- Begin documenting the lessons you've learned for future leaders.
- Focus on multiplication—how can you help others lead well?
- Identify a leader to invest in more deeply.
- Consider legacy-building opportunities (succession planning, mentoring programs).
- Continue building systems that nurture a healthy leadership culture.

#### Legacy Builder (96-100 points)

You are living out a leadership harvest that extends beyond yourself. Your influence leaves a lasting impact, and your faithfulness sets the stage for future leaders.

#### **Next Steps:**

- Share your leadership story and values through writing or speaking.
- Develop a mentoring pipeline to train future leaders.
